

CMP Range Appreciation Series 2700-Point Pistol Match Program

Service Pistol, Match Pistol & CMP .22 Rimfire Pistol

Sponsor: Burbank Rifle & Revolver Club (BRRC)

Eligibility: Open to all eligible participants. You need not be a member of the NRA, CMP, or BRRC to participate

Date & Time: Sunday, August 9, 2020, 7:30 AM for check-in and squadding, first round down range at 8:00 AM.

Course of Fire: Each match will consist of a 900-point aggregate. The 2700-point aggregate is the total for each match fired with a .22 rimfire pistol, a centerfire pistol, and a 45-caliber pistol. Juniors may fire the entire 270 shots with a .22 rimfire pistol. Each 900-point aggregate will consist of 3-10 shot slow-fire strings at 50-yards, then 2-5 shot strings timed fire, 2-5 shot strings rapid fire, 4-5 shot strings timed fire, and 4-5 shot strings rapid fire with all timed and rapid-fire strings at 25-yards. Note: This is a no-sighter match. If you need to sight-in one or more pistols, there will be sight-in targets available prior to the 8:00 AM start time.

Firearm: "Service Pistol," ".22 Rimfire Pistol" or "Match Pistol" as defined in the Current Edition of the CMP Competitions Rulebooks: <http://thecmp.org/competitions/cmp-competitions-rulebooks/>.

Entries: Entries are limited to 20 competitors. Entries are made on the BRRC.org website. Competitors may enter for a single match or all three.

Entry fees: \$10 for a single match or \$20 for all three. Non-BRRC members (except active duty military or juniors) also pay a \$10 guest fee. Competitors wishing to shoot with the 2nd and 3rd matches with the same caliber pistol may do so, but only the first score will be sent to the CMP.

Awards: None, except as may be provided by the CMP. All competitors in a CMP Home Range Appreciation Series match will be sent a commemorative T-shirt and medallion.

Rules: This match will be run in accordance with the current edition of the CMP Pistol Competition Rulebook (see link above). The match will be run in accordance with match pistol rules although service pistols may be used.

Squadding and order of fire: There will be two relays. All competitors, regardless of whether they are shooting one or three pistols, will be squadded on one of these relays during check-in. Relay 1 will shoot their slow-fire shots, followed by relay 2. The targets will then be moved to 25-yards and relay 1 will fire their timed and rapid-fire strings, followed by relay 2. At the completion of the first match, the targets will be moved back to 50-yards for the beginning of the second match. The order of fire for both the second and third matches will be as described above.
